Remarks	
Item Nos. 19&20 May 13, 2014	We have heard the Learned Counsel appearing for
	the parties at some length.
	It is stated by the Learned Counsel appearing for
	the Central Pollution Control Board that in terms of the
	Report of the Board the area is seriously polluted. It is
	stated that the main source of water, namely, the
	Gobind Vallabh Pant Sagar (Rihand Reservoir) is
	seriously polluted with discharge of fly ash and other
	effluents from the industries. There are Thermal Power
	Plants and nearly 1000 other polluting industries. This
	position is really not in dispute.
	This case can be bifurcated in two different heads.
A /-	Firstly-remedies, precautions and the steps that are
	required to be taken to prevent and control the pollution
A L	in the area caused by Thermal Power Plants and other
	industries.
	Secondly, which is more important, the steps to
00 z	prevent pollution and ensure supply of wholesome water
V	for drinking purposes at least to the residents of the
	critically polluted areas as defined by the
	Government/Board itself.
1	As far as the former is concerned the Learned
1000	Additional Solicitor General of India has informed us that he would be consulting all the concerned Authorities
	including the Chief Secretary of the State of Madhya
3	Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh and suggest the Committee(s)
	which would conduct the survey/s to find out the extent
	of pollution, contributors of pollution, and remedies and
	steps that are required for restoration of the Environment
	and the prevention of the pollution. He prays for some
	time in this regard.
	We grant one week time as prayed for by the
	Respondents to inform us as to the Members of the
	Committee(s) who should conduct the survey in question
	and even to prepare the Terms of Reference for this
	Committee(s).
	As far as the later is concerned, we pass the
	following directions on the basis of "Polluter Pays"

principle and Doctrine of Prevention.

- a) The States of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh shall ensure that pure drinking water, free from any contamination is available to all the people living in the area defined as critically polluted area forthwith.
- b) The State of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh shall provide this water through tankers immediately and Report to the Tribunal that drinking water is made available to the residents of the area on the next date of hearing.
- c) On the basis of Doctrine of "Polluter Pays", we hereby direct the Chief Secretaries of State of Uttar Pradesh and State of Madhya Pradesh to direct all the large industries operating in that area including and particularly the thermal power plants to provide, install and commission RO (Reverse Osmosis) plants of reasonable capacity commensurate with the local demands in order to ensure supply of uncontaminated drinking water to all the affected villages which are located in the critically polluted areas.
- d) For this purpose the said State Governments shall within one week from today communicate to each of these industries their obligation to discharge their Corporate Social Responsibility and accordingly direct them to provide, install, commission such prescribed numbers of RO plants commensurate with local demand/population at the places earmarked by the Officers of the Government in each village situated in critically polluted areas.
- e) Cost of such plants shall be borne by these industries in advance and/or get such plants installed within two weeks after the intimation is given by the State Governments. In the event of default the State Pollution Control Board and the Central Pollution Control Board both or any of them may serve Notice for closure upon the

informed industries as per the above terms.

- f) These ROs shall be maintained and operated by the respective industries in collaboration with the beneficiaries i.e. the residents of the Villages. However, the operations shall be monitored by the SPCB and the SDM in-charge of the area and they shall ensure that ROs are in operation and are providing uncontaminated drinking water.
- g) We hereby restrain all industries/units
  Governmental Departments, private individuals
  or any person from dumping any waste of any
  kind generated either from mining, industrial or
  even from domestic activity on the catchment
  area of the Water Reservoirs particularly the
  Gobind Vallabh Pant Sagar and Rihand
  Reservoir as well as the connected rivers.
