	<b>Item No. 6 November 24, 2014 A</b>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Appeal No. 72 of 2014</u></b></p> <p>We have heard the Learned counsel appearing for the parties. A Joint inspection was conducted and in the said inspection it being found that the industrial effluent except Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) therein adheres to the prescribed standard. Actual TDS is 2716 mg/l in place of prescribed TDS of 2100 mg/l. Rest all the parameters as already noticed are found to be in order. We may also notice that the Officer of Punjab Pollution Control Board have also inspected the industry and they have found the TDS in excess of the prescribed standard.</p> <p>The joint inspection team has not made any adverse remark in regard to the functioning of the industry and operation of its STP.</p> <p>We dispose of this Appeal. Set aside the impugned order with a direction that the industry shall bring its TDS level in the effluent below 2100 within 4 weeks from today and shall continue to maintain the effluent standards within prescribed limit. In the event of</p>

default the industry shall be liable to be shut down and would not be given any further time to comply with the directions in this Order. The Appellant shall file an undertaking before the Tribunal to comply with this direction within one week from today. In the event the undertaking is not filed and the Industry does not comply with the above directions within the stipulated period, the Punjab Pollution Control Board shall close the industry.

With the above directions, the Appeal No. 72 of 2014 finally stands disposed of.

**M.A. NO. 632 of 2014**

This Misc. Application does not survive for consideration in view of the fact that the Appeal itself has been disposed of.

Accordingly, M.A. No. 632 of 2014 stands disposed of.
