	decided to experiment destination buses. He has
	submitted before us today a Status Report on the existing
	system of buses and the proposed destination bus system
	to be introduced.
	After hearing the Learned Counsel appearing for the
	parties, including NCT Delhi, we direct as follows:
	1. That as proposed, the NCT Delhi, all other

	of the State shall introduce destination buses with
	effect from 1st May, 2017, as suggested and without

	3. The buses initially, on experimental basis, would

	buses, from these points, will start from the main
	bus stand of the sectors or spots which are

	buses. They will start preferably in the early hours
	of the day to ensure that the persons travelling by

	time. These buses would be directed towards
	Central Secretariat, Shashtri Bhawan, Krishi
	Bhawan, Connaught Place, Nehru Place and such
	other centres where large number of offices are

located. These destination buses would in the evening; coinciding with the office hours, return from the point of their destination to the starting point i.e. the places from where they had carried the passengers in the morning.

- 4. We direct the Director, Transport of NCT Delhi to ensure that all these buses reach on time without default and to the convenience of the public at large. The Director of Transport along with the Joint Commissioner of Police, Traffic would submit a Report in respect of the reduction of individual cars as a result of introduction of the destination buses. If necessary, they can make enquiry from the persons of the buses, whether they were earlier travelling by their own cars.
- 5. The destination vehicles would be maintained properly and DTC would depute special officers from their circle who would be responsible for cleaning, for maintaining hygiene of the vehicles as well as that they would operate punctually and the staff would treat the passengers with respect and decency. The Status Report shall be filed by the Director and Joint Commissioner of Police to the Tribunal after a period of three weeks of running of these destination buses.
- 6. The NCT Delhi and Joint Commissioner of Police, Traffic shall duly advertise, w.e.f. 25th April, 2017 information daily for the public at large.

It is brought to our notice that the Committee has been constituted by NCT Delhi. The Report of that Committee shall be implemented only subject to orders of Item No. the Tribunal. 24 to 29 April 20, 2017 We direct NCT Delhi and all the Corporations to ensure that vacuum cleaning machines start operating in areas of Delhi where the roads are wide enough, positively by 1st May, 2017. The Joint Commissioner of Police is directed to ensure construction of appropriate walls at Rao Tula Road (RTR) and fix red light blinkers. The wall, at the point where the bridge starts, should be extended by at least 2-3 mtr. Wherever U-turns have been provided, the red light blinkers shall be fixed to ensure there is no unruly overtaking and traffic jams at such points.
