October 10,	As indicated earlier, the Committee has filed its report dated
2014	01.10.2014. After going through all the information's and
0	spot verification, the Committee has given following options

10	(a) The installation of Wet Rendering Plant is successful if 2-
	3 fallen animals will come to the plant daily for disposal.
_	Otherwise its viability is not possible because
	maintenance expenses are so high to bear. Moreover its
	cost would be 50-55 lacs including building. The
	B.D.P.O Bhunga and Dasuya have also reported that the
	number of falling animals of the area is not more than 30
	per month. The reports of B.D & P.Os are annexure R2
	and 3.
	(b) The representative of Deputy Director, Animal
	Husbandry Hoshiarpur reported vide letter no. 422 dated

26.9.2014 that wet rendering plant(Carcass Utilization Plant) at village Chadial was set up in the year 2000 and the same was closed in the next year due to shortage of falling animals as raw material. He also disclosed that the machinery of this closed plant has been rusted which to be get repaired and approximately an expenditure of Rs. 20 lacs will be incurred to make this plant functional which is only 25K.Ms away from the Garhdiwala town. The report is annexure R3.

- (c) The Executive Officer, Municipal Council, Gardhiwala visited factory M/S Misra Boilers Pvt. Ltd. E-646, F Block Phase-VII Focal Point Ludhiana for guidance of machinery, capacity and cost of related vessels. He reported that main part of the plant is vessel cooker, the cost of which would be 10-12 lacs. The cost of other parts depends upon the size and drawing. If the old closed plant at village Chadial is to be made functional, then the repair of this plant is possible from this factory. The report of E.O.M.C is annexure R5.
- (d) The Team members also disclosed that in case of 1-2 falling animals within a week, small tractor and lift can be used, the expenditure of which will be 5 to 8 lacs. By this process after de-skinning the dead animals, the remaining parts are to be axed and buried with the help of lime and salt. By this process, the buried remains would be disappears in the earth within 3-4 months. This option has already been suggested to Hon'ble National Green Tribunal, New Delhi and the Hon'ble N.G.T did not accept this option with the view that it is an old process.

The learned Counsel appearing for the State

Government would submit that the State Government is making a study of the said recommendations made by the Committee and appropriate report will be filed before this Tribunal on the next date of hearing. Accordingly, for filing the report the matter stands adjourned to 11.11.2014. (Dr. P. Jyothimani) (Dr. G.K. Pandey)
