Public Authorities cannot be permitted to take this matter leisurely and for such a apathy cannot be permitted to continue. All the officers present have been directed to provide due assistance to the Learned Counsel who would ensure to have appropriate document in relation to queries raised before the Tribunal which we again record as follows:

- 1. Total income generated by the Corporation along with the money that is advanced by the Government to the Corporation.
- 2. Total expenditure, Plan and Non-Plan.
- 3. Total number of vehicles used for transportation of generated waste. Whether such vehicles are fixed with GPS System or not.
- 4. Methodology weighing of waste loading and unloading.
- 5. What directions were issued by the Central Pollution
 Control Board and Delhi Pollution Control
 Committee keeping in view chaos in relation to
 municipal solid waste in Delhi now for years.
- 6. If, Corporations has prepared any Joint Action Plan for collection, processing, transportation and disposal of municipal solid waste in accordance with rule in Delhi, particularly in relation to 94 Acres of land that have been allotted by Delhi Development Authority to various Corporations. The purpose for which such sites are to be used.
- 7. The Learned Counsel appearing for the NCT, Delhi would specifically submit that as to what steps have been taken by the Chief Secretary, Delhi/Additional

Secretary, Urban Development in furtherance to the Item No. order of the Tribunal dated 02nd December, 2016. 01 & 02 January We are informed that, subject to verification, no 13, 2017 amount, much less than the amount of Rs. 1800 Crores, SS have been invested on land or otherwise in the Delhi Development Authority by all the Municipal Corporations. The Learned Counsel to verify the same in this behalf. List this matter on 17th January, 2017 at the end of the board. All concerned officers will be present before the Tribunal on that date.
