Order No. 8 31st August, 2015	<p>We have heard the Learned Counsel for the Applicant as well as the Additional Advocate General appearing for SEAC and SEIAA along with Ms. Parul Bhadoria, Learned Counsel. Reply on behalf of SEAC and SEIAA which has been filed today is ordered to be taken on record.</p> <p>During the course of hearing particularly with reference averments made in the reply and the submission of the Additional Advocate General that the Government is contemplating to take a policy decision with regard to river bed mining and in particular with reference to mining been restricted on the dry river beds. It was however brought to the notice of the Learned Additional Advocate General that views of the SEAC and SEIAA may be taken into account on issues pertaining to the definition of the high flood level while determining the areas for carrying out the sand mining and with reference to similar condition as is there in 61 mining leases in Para 5 prohibiting mining of sand from the river during the monsoon period, that is, from 1st July to 31st October.
